Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the child protection procedures to follow if she has any concerns about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder understands how to provide a safe environment. She maintains her first-aid qualification and public liability insurance.
- The childminder knows the importance of helping children develop skills to support their future learning and the move on to school. For example, she knows how to help children develop their self-confidence, independence and behaviour.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing partnerships with parents and other settings, to contribute to a shared approach in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how children learn and develop. She knows how to plan activities, make observations and assess and monitor children's progress.
- The childminder understands the need to reflect on her practice, and identify areas for development. She realises the importance of updating her skills and knowledge, to help improve her provision and to support children's outcomes.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to monitor children's development, plan for their learning and work in partnership with parents.
- The inspector assessed the childminder's knowledge and understanding of the requirements.
- The inspector looked at a range of documentation and discussed relevant records that the childminder plans to use when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and discussed the resources the childminder intends to provide.
