## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the child protection procedures. She will take prompt action, should she have any concerns about a child in her care, to protect their welfare. The childminder understands her role and responsibility in risk assessing her home to ensure it is safe and secure for children.
- The childminder has a variety of suitable toys and resources that she will use to help children make progress. She knows how to use observations and assessments to plan age-appropriate activities and to help identify children's next steps.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's personal skills, to prepare them for their future learning. For example, she will role model good behaviour, such as respect and tolerance. Children will have opportunities to play outdoors.
- The childminder plans to work closely with parents and other professionals, to establish a consistent approach in children's care and education. She will seek their views to help her evaluate her practice and to prioritise areas for improvement.
- The childminder continues to support her professional development to secure her skills and her knowledge of the learning and welfare requirements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises available for childminding and checked the suitability of the available toys and resources.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she intends to deliver the safeguarding and welfare requirements, and the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector examined relevant documents, including the childminder's first-aid certificate and her safeguarding policies and procedures.
