Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder extends a warm and friendly welcome. She demonstrates a good understanding of how children learn. She is aware that children learn in different ways and that she needs to provide appropriate challenges to help them make progress.
- The childminder understands the benefits of partnership work with parents and other professionals. She gains information from parents and children's teachers in order to support the children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard and protect children. She is aware of the appropriate action to take if she has any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. She is aware of the benefit of providing daily opportunities for children to be physically active.
- The childminder understands how to positively manage children's behaviour. She also recognises the importance of helping children to develop their independence.
- The childminder understands the benefit of reviewing her practice to help her continually improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked areas of the childminder's home that are used when caring for children and discussed how she would deliver the educational programmes.
