## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the early years foundation stage and her related responsibilities. She understands the need to use professional development to help enhance her knowledge and skills as well as the importance to keep up to date.
- The childminder knows how to use observation and assessments to monitor children's learning and help them to make progress. She understands how to provide age-appropriate experiences that help to prepare children for their next stage of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of maintaining children's good health and of promoting their understanding of healthy lifestyles. She knows how to support children with their self-care skills and provide them with daily opportunities outdoors.
- The childminder knows the importance of establishing partnerships with parents and other professionals, to have a shared approach to meeting children's needs.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of child protection procedures and how to refer concerns to the relevant agencies. She knows how to maintain a safe and secure environment, suitable for children's use, through undertaking a risk assessment of it.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage and how she intends to meet these when children attend in the future.
- The inspector and the childminder looked at the areas and resources available for children's use.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she would deliver the educational programmes when caring for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector looked at and discussed a range of records, policies and procedures with the childminder.
- The inspector discussed safeguarding procedures and how the childminder intends to keep children safe.
