## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain a valid first-aid certificate as required. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register requirements and the childminder is unable to demonstrate how she will continually promote children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder has systems to share relevant information with parents and others involved in children's development to provide a consistent approach to learning.
- The childminder understands the different areas of learning and demonstrates how she will provide appropriate learning opportunities for children indoors and outdoors.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of child protection procedures and her responsibility for recording and reporting concerns.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice and reviewing the service she provides. She recognises the importance of working with other professionals and parents to meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder knows how to promote healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide children with healthy snacks and understands how to promote their physical development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:**
