Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not kept her safeguarding knowledge up to date. She does not understand the local procedures that she should follow to report concerns about children's welfare. She is not aware of changes in safeguarding legislation that can impact the safety of children.
- The childminder does not have a procedure in place to advise parents how to make a complaint or to respond to any complaints received.
- The childminder is not aware of her responsibility to monitor children's learning to target teaching effectively. She has limited knowledge of the areas of learning and how to implement them.
- The childminder has carried out first-aid training. She is aware of her responsibility to keep a record of the accidents that occur to children in her care.
- The childminder understands the importance of children having regular fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands how to keep the children safe from risks in the environment. She is aware of the importance of ensuring that children are only in contact with people who are safe and suitable.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
