## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows about her responsibility to protect children's welfare. She is able to identify the signs and symptoms of abuse and knows how to report concerns.
- The childminder talks about how regular risk assessments help her to identify and take action to minimise hazards to children.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's independence. She understands how to implement positive behaviour management strategies.
- The childminder knows how to tailor planning to meet children's needs and interests. She understands the importance of helping them to develop essential skills, including communication and language.
- The childminder recognises the importance of sharing information about each child's care and learning needs with their parents and staff at other settings they attend.
- The childminder knows that regularly reflecting on her practice helps her to identify specific areas for development to support ongoing improvement. She has addressed the action raised at the last inspection.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks of all adults living in her home.
- The inspector viewed areas of the premises that will be used by children and discussed the equipment and toys that will be available to them.
