#### The provision meets requirements

- The leader understands how to support children's emotional development and their progress in all areas of learning. She has secure methods to assess and monitor children's development and to plan for their next steps in learning.
- The leader recognises the importance of safely recruiting and managing staff. She knows the procedures to follow to check that staff are safe and suitable to work with children. She understands the benefits of training and how to monitor staff practice to raise the quality of teaching.
- The leader recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to meet children's needs. She understands how to keep them informed and involved in their child's learning and development.
- The leader has a good understanding of how to keep children safe, and to check for and manage risks in the environment. The leader has a secure understanding of child protection matters and the local procedures for safeguarding children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
