Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Staff understand the content of the safeguarding policy. They are aware of the signs of abuse and neglect and the local referral procedures to follow to protect children. Staff are aware of the duty to prevent children from being drawn into situations that may put them at risk of significant of harm.
- The out-of-school club premises within the host school are secure. Staff know how to minimise potential risks in all areas. All staff keep their safeguarding and first-aid knowledge current.
- Staff understand their role to provide information for parents. They recognise the importance of keeping documentation and records up to date. Admission forms include details about children's different care and dietary needs.
- Staff provide activities and resources that are varied and suitable for the children in the Reception class and those who are older. They recognise the value of working with teachers as well as parents to ensure continuity for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector spoke to the provider, the manager and staff throughout the inspection.
- The inspector held a meeting with the provider and the manager. She looked at evidence of the suitability and qualifications of staff working in the setting.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and a range of other documentation.

Chameleon Kids Club registered in 2013. The out-of-school club employs three members of childcare staff. The manager holds an early years qualification at level 3 and two staff hold appropriate qualifications at level 2. The club operates term time from 8am until 9am and from 3pm to 5.30pm.
