

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Ofsted conducted an inspection of this setting on 20 October 2017. We raised a number of welfare requirement notices (WRN's) to ensure that the provider was meeting requirements of registration. We also raised a number of notices to improve (NTI's) that linked to the learning and development requirements of the early year's foundation stage. The full details of these notices are recorded in the published inspection report.

On 21 November 2017, Ofsted conducted an unannounced monitoring visit to the setting to assess compliance with the WRN's and NTI's. We found the provider had taken effective action to ensure all requirements were met. The provider has implemented safeguarding training for all staff and managers. The impact is that improved procedures are in place to record and monitor accidents and incidents. Staff are clear of their roles and responsibilities to safeguard children. The nursery safeguarding policy and procedures are understood by all staff. Staff demonstrated a confidence in explaining what they would do if they had concerns, including whistle-blowing concerns. These improvements in practice help to ensure that children are kept safe in the setting.

Managers are now undertaking supervision with all staff and they are spending more time in the rooms observing and modelling good practice. Managers shared that they have been given the support of an administrator which has allowed them to focus on supporting staff. Managers are now more able to assist staff with planning and assessment systems. Discussions with staff demonstrate that this has helped to improve practice. Observations showed that staff were deployed well to meet children's individual needs and interests. The environment was set up with a range of age appropriate activities and experiences that engaged the interests of the children. We reviewed evidence that showed the provider has worked positively with the local authority. This has helped to bring about the improvements that were

required following the last inspection.

The provider will have a further full inspection within six months' time, where we will continue to monitor the quality of the provision.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
