## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a robust understanding of her role in keeping children safe. She knows the procedure to follow and who to contact should she have concerns about a child's welfare. She assesses the risks that may arise in her home and on outings.
- The childminder has a thorough understanding of how to promote positive behaviour strategies with children.
- The childminder demonstrates an awareness of the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals involved in children's care. She understands the need to share relevant information.
- The childminder demonstrates a thorough understanding of how to use observation, assessment and planning to support children to make progress.
- The childminder understands how to support children's health and physical well-being. She knows to provide children with healthy food and regular exercise.
- The childminder demonstrates how she regularly seeks the views of parents and children and uses this information to drive ongoing improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the education programmes for children.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation the childminder uses.
- The inspector looked at all areas of the childminder's home available for minding children.
- The inspector discussed childcare practices with the childminder.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other household members.
