Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Leaders understand how to monitor the provision effectively. The manager intends to make more use of already established audits to help develop the provision further.
- Leaders understand their responsibilities to protect the welfare of the children in their care. They are able to implement appropriate child protection procedures and systems to help ensure children's safety including for risk assessment and safe staff recruitment.
- The manager understands the importance of ensuring every child is fully included. She has developed clear arrangements for establishing a key-person system to help support individual needs and manage children's health and emotional well-being.
- The manager understands the importance of providing children with fun, interesting activities which they enjoy. She has already established an activity planning programme and ways to respond to children's individual learning needs, interests and ideas.
- The manager understands the importance of partnership working. She intends to communicate closely with teachers and parent to help plan and provide fun play opportunities, which helps children to build on the skills they learn in school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with one of the setting's directors. They discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements and checked evidence of the suitability of staff.
- The inspector toured the premises. She discussed risk assessment and the activities and equipment on offer.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures of the setting and viewed documentation relevant to children in the early years age range.
- The inspector discussed with the manager how she intends to plan and provide activities which build on children's learning in school.
- The inspector spoke with children of junior school age and observed the activities provided for them.

Abc Childcare at Broomfields registered in 2015. The club employs nine members of staff. The manager holds an appropriate early years degree and the deputy manager holds a degree in PE and School Sports. The setting also employs a staff member who holds sports coaching awards. The club opens each weekday from 7.30am to 8.50am and 3.20pm to 6pm. A holiday club also operates during most school holidays from 7.30am to 6pm.
