Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to monitor children's learning and plan for their ongoing development. She understands how to support children's individual learning needs and preferences by providing a range of resources and activities, indoors and outdoors.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding and welfare requirements. She has developed procedures to help her identify, record and report any concerns about children's welfare. She has a valid paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder recognises the importance of getting to know children and their families well. She knows how to gather information about children's specific needs and routines, and use it effectively to help them settle in and provide continuity in their care.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate the quality of her provision and identify where she can make improvements. She knows how to develop her professional skills, for example, through training and researching ideas for new activities.
- The childminder understands how to support children's enjoyment of healthy lifestyles. She recognises her responsibility to provide daily outdoor play and to help children make healthy choices about what they eat.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector talked with the childminder about her knowledge of the learning and development requirements, including arrangements for assessing children's progress.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents and discussed the records and policies the childminder will use for childminding.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector checked the suitability of the indoor and outdoor areas, and a range of resources used for childminding purposes.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will evaluate her provision and plan improvements.
