Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not ensure that all required documentation is being kept as required. This specifically relates to attendance records and children's personal information.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of safeguarding. She knows what procedures to follow if concerns about children's safety and welfare arise.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing a safe environment. She has appropriate systems in place to keep children safe while in her setting or on outings.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's health. She has systems in place to work in partnerships with parents and maintain two-way information flow.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning and development across all areas of learning. She knows how to assess and monitor children's progress and plan challenging activities to meet their individual learning needs.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to behave well and to respect others.
- The childminder understands the importance of training and self-evaluation to drive continuous improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
