Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of how to safeguard children and she regularly updates her training. This helps to keep her knowledge of her responsibility to report any child protection concerns current.
- The childminder demonstrates an awareness of how to observe and assess children's development. She has a good understanding of how to use this information to plan a range of activities to meet children's individual needs and motivate them to learn.
- The childminder has a wide range of resources which covers all areas of learning.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to develop positive relationships with parents and other early years professionals, to provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of updating her skills and knowledge to help identify areas where she can make improvements to her practice.
- The childminder knows how to support children's healthy lifestyles and well-being, such as through providing regular physical exercise and nutritional snacks.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she has addressed the previous recommendations and how she plans to develop her practice.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she works with parents to develop positive relationships, and read letters of reference to gain parents' views on the service they have received.
