## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder provides a safe and suitable premises. She understands the importance of keeping children within her sight or hearing at all times, including on outings. The childminder knows how to help children learn how to keep themselves safe.
- The childminder understands how to assess and plan for children's learning and development to help them make progress in preparation for school. She knows how to work in partnership with parents and other professionals to encourage consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands safeguarding procedures and knows what to do if she has concerns about children's welfare. For example, she is aware of indicators of children at risk of harm from extreme views and behaviours.
- The childminder knows how to support healthy lifestyles. She understands the importance of encouraging physical exercise and a nutritious diet.
- The childminder understands how to help children learn about behaviour expectations and to respect people different from themselves.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed various aspects of practice with the childminder.
- The inspector observed areas of the premises accessible to children.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, such as the childminder's training certificates.
