Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of how to work in partnership with parents to promote consistency in children's learning and development.
- The childminder discusses how she reflects on her practice to help her continually improve. She acknowledges the importance of gaining the views of parents and children to help with this process.
- The childminder understands how to promote positive behaviour. She discusses how she communicates clear expectations for behaviour to children.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She knows the signs and symptoms of abuse and how to make a referral if she has concerns about a child.
- The childminder understands how to complete observations to assess children's progress and how to use this information to plan for children's next steps in learning.
- The childminder explains how she promotes children's health and well-being. She discusses that children have regular opportunities for developing their physical skills and getting outside in the fresh air.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector checked areas of the childminder's home that are used when caring for children and discussed how she plans to deliver the educational programmes.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and people living at the premises and talked with the childminder about her self-evaluation and improvement plans.
