## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to keep children safe from harm. She has completed safeguarding training. The childminder maintains a safe, welcoming environment and has robust procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child.
- The childminder knows the importance of working with parents, other professionals and other settings children attend.
- The childminder knows how to assess children and identify their starting points in collaboration with parents. She understands how to use her wide range of inclusive toys and resources to challenge and extend children's learning. The childminder has systems in place to assess and monitor children's development.
- The childminder continues to improve her provision with a strong emphasis on promoting children's physical health. She works with other local providers to share good practice and help maintain her skills.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's independence, self-confidence and positive emotional well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector looked at a range of health and safety policies and documents.
- The inspector discussed self-evaluation and plans for improvement with the childminder.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability of all members of the household.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
