

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Ofsted conducted an inspection of this setting on 30 October 2017. We raised a number of welfare requirement notices (WRN's) to ensure that the provider was meeting requirements of registration. We also raised a number of notices to improve (NTI's) that are linked to the learning and development requirements of the early year's foundation stage. The full details of these notices are recorded in the published inspection report.

On 27 November 2017, Ofsted conducted an unannounced monitoring visit to the setting to assess compliance with the WRN's. We found the provider had taken effective action to ensure all requirements were met.

Staff are now allocated specific children who they are responsible for when on outings and ensure all children are kept within their sight and/or hearing at all times.

Staff are now aware of the importance of recording all accidents, injuries and the first aid treatment given. Accidents were found to be appropriately recorded and this information was promptly shared with parents. All staff hold a paediatric first aid certificate and now understand the importance of administering first aid promptly if a child has an accident.

Staff were observed to use appropriate strategies to manage children's behaviour. They explain to children why their behaviour is not acceptable and help children to understand the consequences of their actions. Staff were observed to praise children to positively reinforce good behaviour.

The risk assessments for outings have been reviewed and further developed. Staff are now effectively deployed to ensure children are appropriately supervised at all times to ensure their safety. The manager reported that they will no longer be using the soft play area within the building where the

setting is situated. This is because the section for children under four years does not meet the children's needs.

These improvements in practice help to ensure that children are kept safe in the setting and on outings.

The provider will have a further full inspection, within six months of the last inspection, when we will continue to monitor the quality of the provision.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
