Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of possible signs and symptoms of abuse. The childminder knows the procedures that she must implement should she feel a child is at risk.
- The childminder has all required documentation in place. She holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate and maintains her public liability insurance.
- The childminder is clear about how she will help children to prepare for school.
- The childminder explained how she maintains a suitable, safe and secure environment.
- The childminder has a dedicated playroom and a suitable range of resources, toys and equipment to meet the age and stage of development of individual children.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating the quality of care and education she offers as well as seeking the views of parents and children.
- The childminder explained how she helps children to understand the benefits of eating healthily, good hygiene practice and the importance of fresh air and exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector toured the premises and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding requirements and the precautions the childminder will take to keep children safe.
- The inspector checked documentation the childminder is required to maintain, including suitability checks.
