Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a robust understanding of child development and knows how to observe, plan and monitor children's learning to help them make progress. She knows how to offer an inclusive service and how to manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder effectively evaluates her practice. She exhibits a commitment to her professional development and has addressed the action set at the last inspection. She has rigorous improvement plans in place to help her to continually improve.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working. She understand how to establish links with external professionals and knows how to effectively engage parents in their children's learning and development.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of all safeguarding practices. She is aware of the possible signs, symptoms and indicators of abuse and neglect. She knows the referral procedure very well and understands the steps to take if an allegation is made against herself or a family member.
- Risk assessments are robust and the childminder is astute to how she intends to deal and respond to different medical emergencies as they arise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises where childcare is to be provided.
- The inspector had a discussion with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to plan and provide learning experiences for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's methods for reviewing the quality and effectiveness of her provision.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability records and looked at the childminder's qualifications and training certificates.
