Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate, as required.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of her role and responsibilities in relation to child protection. She knows the procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to provide an enjoyable range of experiences for children and has a suitable range of resources available.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to work with parents to keep them up to date about their children's care and achievements.
- The childminder has appropriate systems in place to work with the local schools the children attend to help share information about the children's care and welfare.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how to teach children to respect differences between themselves and others. She is confident in tackling any negative stereotypes and instances of discrimination.
- The childminder regularly evaluates her practice and has a realistic overview of the quality of the service provided.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2014. She lives in Cannock, West Midlands. The childminder operates all year round from 7.30am to 6.30pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays. She holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 3. There were no children on roll in the early years age group at the time of this inspection.
