Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to use effective observations and assessments to plan activities based around children's interests and capabilities. She has an extremely well-equipped playroom with a wide range of play materials to support all areas of learning.
- The childminder provides a clean, safe and comfortable environment. She knows how to identify and minimise potential risks, indoors and outside. The childminder maintains public liability insurance and holds a current first-aid qualification.
- The childminder understands her child protection responsibilities. She knows about wider safeguarding concerns and understands the correct steps to take if an allegation is made against herself or a family member.
- The childminder offers an inclusive service. She knows to obtain plenty of information from parents to enable her to support children's individual needs right from the start.
- The childminder has well-established links with local pre-schools and schools, to promote consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the need to continually evaluate and improve her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
