## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained an up-to-date paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The childminder has an excellent understanding of how to identify the potential signs of abuse. She is confident about the local procedures in place to report concerns.
- The childminder explains how to work with parents from the start. For example, she intends to gather information to help her to establish children's starting points and has systems in place to share regular information with them.
- The childminder understands how young children learn. She intends to observe them, make regular assessments and plan a range of challenging and exciting activities.
- The childminder knows of the support available through outside agencies. She explains how she will liaise and work with them if the need arises.
- The childminder values the importance of offering an inclusive service. She describes how she intends to teach children about the diverse society in which they live.
- The childminder explains how she intends to evaluate her service to help drive forward improvements. She describes how she plans gather the views of parents in the process.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:**
