The provision meets requirements

- The childminder describes how she plans to safeguard children. She has an up-to-date understanding of child protection issues. She describes how she would identify concerns about a child's safety or welfare and the procedures she would follow in that instance.
- The childminder intends to observe children's learning, assess their development and plan activities and play opportunities to help them to develop. She plans to monitor children's progress to help to identify gaps. She has a good understanding of how to work in partnership with other professionals, such as health visitors.
- The childminder values the importance of working with parents. She describes how she intends to gather information to inform initial and ongoing assessments.
- The childminder explains how she plans to evaluate her setting and intends to develop actions plans. She plans to make continual improvements to her service.
- The childminder intends to ensure that children are offered the opportunity to learn about differences and similarities between themselves and others. She values the importance of offering an inclusive service for all children and families.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
