## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an excellent understanding of the learning and development requirements. She plans to use her knowledge of the areas of learning to teach children skills for the future, such as mathematics, language and communication and social skills.
- The childminder discusses how she monitors her own practice and that of her assistant. She shows a strong commitment to identifying future developments for improvements to her setting.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She understands the local procedures to follow should she have a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder describes how she intends to promote children's positive behaviour and a respect for their peers and the environment.
- The childminder describes how she plans to work in partnership with parents, other early years settings and local schools to support children's emotional well-being.
- The childminder is enthusiastic about her role and understands the importance of fostering strong relationships with children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver educational programmes for children and undertake planning, observations and assessments.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and her assistant and discussed her understanding of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the documentation she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the home intended for childminding purposes, including the area for overnight care.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her plans for future improvement and continuous development.
