- The setting has a wide range of suitable, good-quality play resources.
- The manager demonstrates an appropriate knowledge of how to manage children's behaviour. He knows how to work together with staff, teachers and parents to support children's understanding of sharing and working together.
- The staff and the manager know how to use the key-person system to help meet children's emotional needs and to help them settle.
- The manager understands the importance of using self-evaluation to identify and target priorities for improvement.
- The manager is aware of how to promote children's awareness of healthy lifestyles, such as through healthy snacks, meals and opportunities for children to be physically active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. Fit For Sport at Holy Trinity C Of E Junior School registered in 2015. It operates from Holy Trinity C Of E Junior School in Wallington, located in the London Borough of Sutton. The club opens five days a week from 3.25pm until 6pm, during term time only. There are three staff employed to work with the children, one of whom holds a relevant childcare qualification at level 3.
