## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of her responsibilities to keep children safe. She knows how to identify, and report concerns about children in her care. The childminder knows how to minimise risks to children in her home and the need to be vigilant about children's safety when outdoors.
- The childminder understands that children learn through play and has a wide range of resources to support children's learning. She knows how to assess their development and plan for their next stages in learning.
- The childminder knows the importance of building strong partnerships with parents and other professionals involved with individual children.
- The childminder values opportunities to improve her own skills. She links with other providers in her area to share practice and ensure children receive the best of care.
- The childminder knows the importance of children gaining skills that will support their future learning and help them start school with confidence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector toured the areas of the home used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
