- The manager explains the importance of working in partnership with parents and other agencies or professionals to support children's care and learning. She has a positive attitude to evaluating her practice.
- The manager knows how to recognise and report any possible indicators of concern regarding a child's welfare and has trained all the staff, so they understand their roles and responsibilities to keep children safe.
- The manager knows how to support children to behave well. She discusses the importance of teaching children to value and respect each other's views. She understands how to teach children healthy habits, such as being active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Kitties Club was registered in 2015. The out of school club operates from St Paul's RC Primary School, in Waltham Cross, in Hertfordshire. The club employs four members of childcare staff. Of these, three hold an appropriate early years qualification at level 3 and the manager has a social work degree. The club opens from Monday to Friday school term time only. Sessions are from 7.30am until 8.45am and from 3.15pm until 5.45pm.
