## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder describes how she intends to monitor children's development and identify what they need to learn next. She explains how she aims to use observations and assessments to plan a range of activities to support children to make progress.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She demonstrates a deep understanding of child protection issues and talks about how she intends to provide a safe environment for children.
- Through discussion, the childminder explains how she intends to provide an inclusive service. She knows how to be a positive role model and manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder describes how she intends to work in partnership with parents, other settings children attend and other professionals, to promote continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder accesses relevant training to keep her knowledge up to date. She explains how she plans to improve her setting through evaluating her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about the educational programmes and discussed the range of toys, equipment and resources available for children in the early years age group.
- The inspector looked at and discussed a range of records, including policies and procedures, with the childminder.
- The inspector checked documentary evidence of the childminder's suitability to work with children, including her qualifications.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder evaluates her service.
