Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She regularly updates her safeguarding training and is fully aware of her responsibilities to report any concerns.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and to share information about children's learning and development. She knows how to form links with other settings and schools to gain continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's progress and identify the next steps in their learning. She understands how children's interests and next steps should inform effective planning to meet children's individual learning needs.
- The childminder discusses the importance of providing children with a healthy diet and plenty of exercise. She understands how to manage the care of children with special dietary and medical needs.
- The childminder has strategies in place to manage children's behaviour effectively. She understands how to promote children's independence in readiness for school.
- The childminder has a wide range of books and resources that reflects diversity and inclusion. She is aware of the need to gain parents' views when evaluating her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the premises and resources available for children.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder in relation to her understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of observation, assessment and planning for children's progress.
- The inspector looked at the suitability of adults living on the premises, the childminder's training records, children's records and a range of other relevant documentation.

The childminder registered in 2009. She lives in Walthamstow, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest. She holds an early years qualification at level 3. The childminder operates Monday to Friday from 8am until 6pm, during term time only. She occasionally works during school holidays by arrangement.
