- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She knows to encourage two-way communication about children's welfare and learning.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her practice and develop her skills, as well as to offer support and guidance to her registered assistant.

There were no children present when this inspection took place.
