## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to assess, plan and support children's learning to help them make progress. She intends to use her assessments to check children's progress and identify any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to safeguard and protect children. She knows the procedures to follow to report any concerns.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate the service she provides, to help her to identify strengths and areas for development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and other professionals to support continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour positively. She knows how to help children develop confidence and to respect each other's opinions and cultures.
- The childminder understands how to support children to lead healthy lifestyles. She knows the importance of undertaking effective risk assessments to minimize hazards and ensure children are kept safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed and discussed a number of the childminder's documents, including evidence of her suitability.
- The inspector had a tour of the premises and checked all areas of the home the childminder plans to use when caring for children. The inspector viewed the toys, resources and equipment.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to keep children safe and healthy, how she assesses any risks to children and her methods for evaluating her provision.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the early years foundation stage, including how she intends to assess children's abilities and plan for their progress.
