## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not demonstrate a good enough understanding of what to do if she has a concern about a child. She demonstrates a sufficient understanding of other child protection issues.
- The childminder does not have a good enough understanding of the changes and events that must be notified to Ofsted.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers to promote continuity in children's care.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to help prepare children for school. She describes how she intends to support and monitor children's development. She understands her responsibility to promote inclusive practice.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and safety. She discusses the use of risk assessment and other strategies she will use to promote children's safety and welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further
