## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to keep children safe. She has a good knowledge of child protection and how to report concerns regarding children's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing secure relationships with children. She knows how to gain information to provide consistency in their care and learning.
- The childminder values the importance of working with parents and with other professionals involved in children's care. The childminder knows how to share information in a variety of ways to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder understands how to observe, assess and monitor children's progress. She knows how to plan activities for children to help meet their learning needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of self-evaluation and developing her practice and knowledge to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled relevant documentation that the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder of how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
