- The childminder recognises her role in teaching children to respect and value others.
- The childminder knows of the importance of keeping her knowledge and skills up to date and to ensure that her assistant is kept well informed of any changes in legislation.

The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
