Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she will gather initial and ongoing information from parents to plan activities based on what children already know and can do. She understands the importance of establishing good partnerships with parents and other settings that children attend.
- The childminder describes how she will tailor her service to meet children's individual needs. She knows how to assess children's learning and will share information about their progress with parents. Children's welfare will be promoted through explanations of how to behave and good hygiene practices.
- The childminder has completed training to update her knowledge. She regularly evaluates her service and takes steps to improve her practice to make continuous improvements.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to keep children safe. She knows how to identify safeguarding concerns and whom to report to should the need arise. She has effective systems in place to help assure children's safety and welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the resources and areas of the childminder's home that children use.
- The inspector reviewed documents, including evidence of professional development and those used to record information relating to children's safety and health.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and checked evidence of the suitability of household members.
