Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a sound understanding of her responsibility to protect children from harm or abuse. She knows the possible signs and symptoms of abuse to look out for and the procedures she must implement.
- The childminder maintains all the required paperwork and documentation. She holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance is in place.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to provide a range of play experiences across all areas of learning and teach children the skills needed for future learning and school. She describes how she intends to assess children's ongoing progress.
- The childminder understands how to support children's health and well-being. She intends to support parents to provide healthy meals and help children to learn about good hygiene practices and the importance of fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to promote continuity of care for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and discussed the resources, toys and equipment available.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures that underpin the childminder's provision and viewed documentation she intends to use when caring for early years children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding requirements and the procedures the childminder plans to use to help keep children safe.
- The inspector checked certificates and documentation the childminder is required to maintain, including suitability checks for other household members.
