- The childminder knows her responsibility to protect children. She has clear procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to lead a healthy lifestyle, for example, through appropriate routines and activities.
- The childminder effectively demonstrates how she will teach children to understand the importance of respecting and valuing the opinions of other people.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
