## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained a current paediatric first-aid qualification. She does not have public liability insurance.
- The childminder knows how to keep her home free from hazards. She understands current child protection legislation and knows how to report concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how children learn. She knows how to use assessments to plan activities which cover all areas of learning and meet children's needs. She knows the importance of working with parents and other professionals to support children's progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's self-esteem and confidence. She understands how to manage children's behaviour and teach them the importance of respecting others. She knows how to promote diversity and equal opportunities.
- The childminder understands how to include the views of children and parents to evaluate her work and plan for continual improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
