Summary of key findings for parents

This provision is outstanding

- The well-qualified childminder has a tremendous commitment to continuing her professional development to enhance her knowledge. She pursues training that is relevant to the children attending her setting and ensures excellent learning outcomes for children. For example, she has used innovative ideas to support children who are learning English as an additional language.
- The childminder completes precise observations and assessments, and has extremely high expectations of all children. She plans motivating activities that very skilfully meet their interests and extend their learning. All children make outstanding progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder is an exceedingly good role model. For example, she deals with behavioural issues very calmly, and gives superb support when discussing children's emotions and helping them to find resolutions.
- There are superb partnerships with parents. The childminder wholly includes them in determining the starting points for their children's learning and keeps them regularly and fully informed of the progress they make. Parents are exceptionally clear about, and involved in, their children's learning and achievements.
- Children display incredibly high levels of confidence and independence. For example, they are self-sufficient in dealing with the fastenings on their outdoor clothing.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

continue to reflect on and enhance the highly effective monitoring of children's progress to further strengthen the quality of provision.

Inspection findings

Effectiveness of the leadership and management is outstanding

The childminder uses in-depth self-evaluation to reflect on her provision exceptionally well. She identifies targeted priorities to develop her provision superbly. For example, she has added a wealth of script to reflect children's home languages in the environment. Safeguarding is effective. The childminder's comprehensive knowledge of procedures and current safeguarding practice is up to date, and there is an exceptional focus on children's safety and well-being. The childminder monitors children's progress meticulously. This helps her to identify and address any weaknesses in their development quickly. She knows how to access support from other professionals when needed to extend outcomes for children further. The childminder recognises the need to enhance the tracking of children's progress to strengthen further the quality of the provision.

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Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is outstanding

The childminder really challenges children to solve mathematical problems in their play. For example, children confidently sort recipe cards into numerical order and state the number that is one more than the given number. The childminder plans activities exceptionally well to motivate children and extend their communication and understanding skills. For instance, children were really challenged to follow instructions from recipe cards to make cakes using fat for garden birds. The childminder engages children in highly stimulating discussions to understand why things happen, such as how some ingredients can change when heated.

Personal development, behaviour and welfare are outstanding

Children form particularly strong relationships with the childminder and develop immense confidence and self-esteem. They develop remarkable independence and happily take on responsibility. For example, children relish working as a team to sweep up spillages. The childminder takes children frequently on a wide range of very interesting outings to extend their learning. They meet other people and develop an excellent understanding of the world around them. Children enjoy plenty of fresh air and exercise. For instance, the childminder recognises that children prefer to be outdoors, so provides an exceptionally stimulating outdoor play area in which they deeply investigate and explore.

Outcomes for children are outstanding

All children make outstanding progress, given what they know when they start. They maintain excellent concentration for extremely long periods in purposeful activities. Children show incredible curiosity, asking questions, such as what does an image mean they have seen on a milk bottle. They develop a remarkably good understanding of the natural world. For example, they discuss with enormous confidence the life cycles of birds. They are exceptionally well prepared to develop the skills for future learning and school.
