Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and how to report any safeguarding concerns she may have about children to protect their welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation and how to seek the views of others, to help her make positive improvements in her practice to benefit children.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of how to assess children's development. She knows how to plan appropriate activities based on children's next steps to help them make good progress.
- The childminder understands the need to work in partnership with parents and staff from the settings that children attend, to help to meet children's needs consistently.
- The childminder knows how to teach children to lead healthy lifestyles. For example, through providing healthy and nutritious food and opportunities to access outdoors.
- The childminder is aware of the importance to help children develop respect for others and promote positive behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used for the purposes of childminding.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her arrangements to care for children in the early years age range.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including contracts, registers and accident forms as well as documents confirming the suitability of the household members.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her self-evaluation.
