The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress and to plan a range of challenging activities to help support them to make good progress.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to safeguard children. She knows the signs and symptoms that would give her cause for concern about a child's welfare and knows what to do if she has a concern about a child.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the importance of building close relationships with children to ensure they feel settled within her care. She understands how to manage children's behaviour positively.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with regular experiences outdoors and daily exercise and promoting a healthy diet.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals and sharing information with them regularly.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her provision and understands the importance of keeping up to date with changes to improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
