Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the local safeguarding procedures and regularly refreshes her training. She knows the signs and symptoms that would cause her concern and how to respond appropriately.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her service, such as to make sure her resources are of interest to children. She seeks appropriate professional development opportunities which help her to understand children's individual needs.
- The childminder understands how to support children's learning. She knows how to use observation and assessment to help plan for children's future learning.
- The childminder knows how to work in close partnership with parents and other settings children attend to promote continuity in their learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's health and wellbeing and teaching them how to develop healthy lifestyles. She provides children with healthy snacks, fresh drinking water and opportunities for physical play outdoors.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes for children and undertakes observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took the suitability checks of household members into account.
