Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her duty to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She is aware of what would give her anxieties for a child's welfare and of her responsibility to report any child protection concerns.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating and improving her setting. She is proactive in keeping her professional development up to date.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings children attend to provide continuity in their care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and how to support their health and well-being. She provides suitable premises and resources to support all areas of children's learning.
- The childminder understands how to help children gain the skills they need for their future learning, such as good communication, independence and positive attitudes.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes and undertake observations, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she uses when caring for children.
- The inspector toured areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
