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About this inspection

The purpose of this inspection is to assure children and young people, parents, the public, local authorities and government of the quality and standard of the service provided. The inspection was carried out under the Care Standards Act 2000.

Service information

Brief description of the service

A private fostering arrangement is made without the involvement a local authority for the care of a child under 16 years of age. Care is provided by someone other than a parent or close relative with the intention of lasting more than 28 days. The local authority does not approve or register such carers, but it has a duty to ensure the welfare of the child is promoted and safeguarded. Sandwell Borough Council has arrangements in place through its Community Support Services to fulfil its legal responsibilities in this matter. The current role of Ofsted in Private Fostering Arrangements is solely to report on the degree to which the relevant National Minimum Standards have been implemented. Central government will review this in 2009.

Summary

The Authority was unable to present any information at the time of inspection and the inspector was informed that no children were known to be privately fostered. In the following two weeks the Authority submitted such information as was available but this was too late to be effectively inspected. The information included a draft Statement of Purpose, an information leaflet and certain data. The data indicated that three children were being privately fostered.

The overall quality rating is inadequate.

NMS 2 Notifications to the Local Authority The local authority has produced a leaflet about private fostering that is available to the public and satisfactorily meets the standard. There is no programme of publicity or communication. Similarly, there was no evidence of communication with staff. The inspector was informed that social workers have responded to three referrals. This could not be checked and neither could other parts of this Standard. NMS 3 Welfare of Children. It was not possible to inspect this Standard. The Authority reported that it was unable to confirm that all carers had been vetted; this must be addressed forthwith. NMS 4 Advice and Support to Carers The fact that some children have become known to the local authority indicates that their carers had had an opportunity to speak to a social worker. However, this could not be verified. NMS 5 Advice and Support to Parents It was not possible to inspect this Standard. NMS 6 Information to Children. It was not possible to inspect this and Support to inspect this Standard.
