Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have the correct paediatric first-aid qualification in place.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding of how she will keep children safe and secure. She completes daily risk assessments to keep children safe and knows the procedures should she have any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands how children develop and how to support this by planning challenging activities that move their learning forward. She knows how to monitor children's progress to assess and close any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting on her practice and keeping her training up to date. This includes training on wider safeguarding issues, for example, 'Prevent' duty guidance.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other agencies or settings that children attend to provide continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's good behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
