Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a very clear understanding of how to safeguard children's welfare, including the wider safeguarding remit. She understands how to keep children safe and is fully aware of the procedures to follow to report any concerns. She regularly attends safeguarding training and keeps abreast of related issues.
- Through discussion, the childminder clearly demonstrates how she will promote children's learning and development. She describes how she intends to support children to develop skills in readiness for school and how she intends to plan for their learning.
- The childminder demonstrates how she plans to work in partnership with parents to build up a picture of what children already know and can do. She describes how she intends to plan activities based on children's interests and stage of development.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in close partnership with parents and other early years settings that children attend. She knows to provide parents with regular feedback about children's care and learning. This helps to provide continuity in children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
- The inspector viewed a range of documents, such as policies, qualifications and risk assessments.
