The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to monitor children's development and identify what they need to learn next. She understands how she aims to use observations and assessments to offer a range of activities and opportunities to support children to make progress.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of her role and responsibility to safeguard children. She knows to provide a safe environment for children and understands child protection issues and the processes to follow.
- The childminder is aware she needs to offer an inclusive service and help children to learn to respect and value differences between themselves and others.
- The childminder understands that she needs to develop partnerships with parents to help support continuity of care for children's learning and development.
- The importance of evaluating practice to maintain quality is understood by the childminder. She aims to involve others to help her to identify areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
