- The manager understands the need to provide children with a wide range of enjoyable play experiences that take their interests into account and meet their individual needs.
- The management team understands the importance of meeting children's specific health and care requirements. Staff are appropriately trained so that they can meet children's individual needs.
- The management team understands how to work in partnership with parents and other professionals to agree strategies to support children's needs.
- The provider recognises the importance of continually improving the effectiveness of the playscheme through self-evaluation, to help explore what worked well and identify areas to improve at the end of each holiday.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. Palace for All registered in 2015 and operates from St Joseph's Primary School in the London Borough of Islington. The playscheme is open during school holidays, from 10.30am to 3.30pm. There are 19 members of staff, including the manager and sessional staff. The manager holds a relevant degree in early years. The holiday playscheme provides care for children who have special educational needs (SEN) and/or disabilities.
